Apollo 11 Moon Landing 1969

On July 20, 1969, astronauts part of the U.S. National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) landed on the moon. Neil Armstrong and Buzz Aldrin descended to the moon surface in the lunar module, *Eagle*, while Michael Collins remained in orbit around the moon in the command module, *Columbia*. Armstrong, the first human being to place a foot on the surface of the moon, famously said to the global television audience, "That's one small step for a man, one giant leap for mankind."
